## Climate and Ecological Emergency Working Party (CEE\_WP) Report to the Parish Council Meeting – February 2024

- 1. The working party, with the support of John Kenward (Whitchurch South resident) actively supported the microplastics clean-up at Charmouth Beach and river mouth from 24<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> January. The Nurdle organisation estimate that they collected 1.2million nurdles and biobeads. They will be returning for a further clean-up in March. Funding has been provided by South West Water.
- 2. At a meeting of the Clean Rivers of West Dorset group in January, discussions were started with Wessex Water over the possibility of WW conducting regular tests of water samples from the River Char taken by volunteers in the parish. Tests would be for *E. coli*, intestinal enterococci, ammonia, phosphates, nitrates, total dissolved solids and pesticides. We hope to have a decision in the next 2 months. They would enable us to assess pollution from Wessex Water assets, domestic and commercial septic tanks and from farm and agricultural sources.
- 3. John Kenward is coordinating volunteers for the existing Riverfly and Citizen Science river testing programmes and will coordinate volunteers for the above tests if required.
