- briefing our MP on these issues so he and others can have informed conversations with Water Companies, Dorset Council and relevant statutory bodies and agencies and act on our behalf to ensure that our rivers and coastal waters meet the targets set out in the Government's 25 Year Environment Plan (2018) and the Environment Act (2021)

For example (Item 3b):

Ask CL to:
