CROWD: Clean Rivers Of West Dorset

Action points from previous meetings

9th August meeting

- WRAG to report results of bathing water samples taken further east at Seatown by the EA.
- Howard Atkinson (HA) to ask HSE for their response to the human health risk in CROWD rivers & beaches.
- Ian Rees (IR) to do the same with Public Health Dorset.
- Andrew Carey (AC) and Dana Assinder (DA) to invite Simon Browning to talk to CROWD about CaSTCo.
- WRAG to prepare a report on what they have done so far with *E coli* testing on the Winniford.
- AC to chase Wessex Water (WW) on its action points from April.
- HA to gather evidence for the scale of the risks associated with microbial and viral pollution of sand.
- IR to ask Dorset Coast Forum for further thoughts and contacts who we might be able to work with.
- AC and DA to draft a revision of CROWD's stated aims and a statement of how it will issue press releases and public communications (for agreement by all involved, including Chis Loder).
- Lee Ramsden (LR) and HA to prepare a brief report for the meeting on the various chemicals and metrics (e.g. the difference between the three types of phosphate, the relevance of turbidity, etc.)

23rd June meeting

- WRAG to follow up with Wessex Water on bacterial contamination results in the Winniford.
- AC to press WW on the possibility of length-of-river pollution testing to identify pollution types and sources.
- CROWD to feedback to CL any thoughts on blockers to action
- CROWD members to check that beaches in their area are signed up to Pollution Risk Forecasts and alerts are acted upon. Also push for better permanent signage in the river pools.
- Wessex Water (WW) to respond to CROWD's long list of requests (sent 8th June).

14th April meeting

- Chris Loder (CL) to write to Colin Skellett to insist that the 5 sites provisionally scheduled for improvement in the CROWD area in 2025-30 *be* included (referencing the fact that they discharge in or close to a bathing water and in or close to protected sites Lyme Bay MPA and SAC, thus a high priority.) They are: Charmouth WRC; Chideock WRC; West Bay Sluices SPS; Puncknowle WRC; Bridport Wych Farm WRC.
- CL to ask Ofwat to identify blocks to investment in helping homeowners to install soakaways.
- WW to send CROWD a digital copy of the report presented at the April meeting.
- WW to brief CROWD on rainwater separation in new building developments so Chris Loder can follow up.
- WW to brief CROWD on rainwater runoff issues with highways so Chris Loder can follow up (WW update nothing will happen on this "for a while").
- WW to invite CROWD to review the near real time reporting system before it goes live by end of 2023.
- CROWD to compile list of priority sites and send to WW, so it can supply quarterly data.
- WW to share data with CROWD by end of July on the required increase in storage capacity at Sewage Treatment Works and Pumping Stations to reduce/eliminate spills. WW reporting to Defra by 24/6/23
- WW to send info to CROWD on what people can do to help with water butts / rainwater separation at source.

8th February meeting

- Ian Rees (IR) to circulate Water Guardians info and WG survey method to CROWD members. (Agreed that this wasn't the right survey for CROWD but would be helpful entry point for river action groups.)
- IR to share details with CROWD of 2 Dorset AONB surveys (River Char Project & a broader, map-based one.)
- HA to share findings of River Asker group methods to investigate how to measure nitrates and E. coli.
- Steve Evans to gather notes on Foundry Lea water issues for discussion in CROWD with a view to briefing Chris when we discuss planning issues.
